Open to all students. Students must write a poem, in a style of your choosing, on the theme of overcoming a personal challenge.

ATCO Indigenous Education Awards Program (\$500-\$1500)

Awards are presented to select Indigenous students (**Merit** - \$500 for students completing Grades 10-12, including upgrading; **Bursary** - \$1000 for students registered in a trade, community, or technical college diploma program; **Scholarship** - \$1500 for university or graduate degree students) who demonstrate leadership capabilities and commitment in their quest for higher education. To be considered for an award, students must complete the [online application form](#), and submit the required documentation, including reference letter, proof of enrollment for upcoming school semester, short essay (500-1000 words) describing why you are a suitable candidate, and recent school transcript.

BBPA – Multiple scholarships

The Black Business and Professional Association has been advancing Black business communities, youths and professionals, to create equity and opportunity for all, so no one gets left behind. Through various programs, the BBPA continues to fulfill that promise.

One of such programs, the BBPA National Scholarship Program (NSP) was established in 1986 and is dedicated to supporting and promoting the achievement of academic excellence by Black Canadian youth through an annual scholarship program. It was borne out of the need to reduce the rate at which Black students drop out of school despite their rising intellect, due to unavailability of funds.

The NSP is managed by a volunteer board of trustees appointed by the Black Business and Professional Association (BBPA) and is operated separately from the Harry Jerome Awards and all other BBPA activities. The NSP is also backed by mentorship programs, HR programs, financial literacy programs, skills training and more, in order to give a stronger foundation to applicants.

The NSP receives financial donations from Corporations and individuals that share its mission to support the education and development of Canada's future leaders, through assisting Black youth in their attainment of post-secondary education.

Brandon Walli tragically lost his life at the age of 23 while crossing the road in 2016.

Canada Student Grant for Services and Equipment for Students with Permanent Disabilities

If you require exceptional education-related services or equipment, you may be eligible to receive the Canada Student Grant for Services and Equipment for Students with Permanent Disabilities. This [grant](#) offers up to \$20,000 per academic year (August 1 to July 31) for each year of studies after high school (including undergraduate and graduate levels), provided you continue to meet the eligibility criteria.

Cara Brown Ringette Scholarship

“Applications may be made by ringette players who meet all of the criteria below:

You are registered with one of Ringette Canada’s provincial/territorial member associations and are actively playing ringette at the AA level (or at the highest level offered in the applicant’s community) during the current playing season.

You are entering a Canadian university on a full-time basis for the first time in the next academic year.

You have achieved academic excellence (minimum B average or equivalent).

You have demonstrated a strong commitment to the sport of ringette.

Applicants must be planning to attend a university located in Canada and be able to meet the institution’s admission standards.”

Survivor Scholarship Program is open to young adult cancer survivors who are residents, and currently residing in Canada. The Program supports post-secondary academic endeavors and recognizes the personal triumphs of exemplary students who have survived a childhood cancer journey (diagnosed age 18 years or younger).

Canadian Federation of Independent Grocers

CFIG offers \$15,000 nationally and \$3250 regionally for essays. Applicants must be a Canadian resident and be working for a current CFIG member (retail, associate, affiliate) or be a family member of an employee of a current CFIG member. A 1000 word essay with video is required based on a topic related to agriculture. Topic for 2025-2026 not released yet.

Canadian Hearing Services Scholarship

Canadian Hearing Services proudly offers scholarships to Deaf and hard of hearing students to help break down barriers to higher education and build brighter futures.

Scholarships of \$3,000 a year for full-time students and \$1,000 a year for part-time students are awarded to top qualified candidates who are pursuing post-secondary education at an accredited institution, inside or outside of Canada. Once secured, students may receive an annual award for up to four years. Awards may cover tuition, residence or educational resources. The exact number of awards will be dependent on the number and ranking of qualified applicants.

Canadian Hospitality Foundation

The Canadian Hospitality Industry offers over \$200,000 in scholarships for students wishing to pursue a career in the hospitality, foodservice and tourism industry across Canada annually. Canadian students currently enrolled in post-secondary studies in any recognized foodservice and hospitality program or relevant field of study. Intermittent opportunities with some specific criteria for each.

Canadian Society of Exploration Geophysicists (\$500-\$2500)

The student must be pursuing a course of studies directed toward a career in exploration geophysics or be a dependent of a CSEG member who will be entering university. In order to qualify for an award, students must be enrolled at a Canadian university in an academic program leading to an exploration geophysics career in industry, teaching or research. Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic performance, financial need, interest in geophysics and extra-curricular activities.

Canadian Welding Association

The CWA Foundation Secondary School Awards program was founded in 2014 for the purposes of promoting and encouraging the pursuit of post-secondary education in welding. Range of awards, grants, and bursaries offered. The awards are for students who show an aptitude and passion for the welding industry and/or financial need, and are applying to a certified welding program offered by a publically funded Canadian College or University.

Canadian Wildlife Federation (Orville Erickson Memorial Scholarships & Frances Elizabeth Hilder Scholarship Fund)

These are awarded once per year to post-secondary students in the field of conservation. The fund is administered by the Canadian Wildlife Foundation and is financed entirely by private-sector donations in memory of Orville Erickson, a prominent Canadian conservationist and past CWF president.

The purpose of the Frances Elizabeth Hilder Scholarship is to provide financial assistance, based on academic performance, to post secondary students in the field of forest conservation.

Capsle Bursary (\$1000)

Capsle provides a bursary to provide financial assistance to students entering post-secondary Education and/or Law programs. One \$1,000 bursary is available for the academic year (the "Bursary").

Carlyle Murray Education Foundation Scholarship (\$2000)

Any Grade 12 student in a Regina area high school planning to attend a post-secondary school in Saskatchewan. Applicants will be considered based on academic performance, extra-curricular involvement, and financial need.

Catholic Women's League of Canada – Social Justice Award (\$1000)

This award is open to Grade 12 females who demonstrate involvement in social justice activities. Recommendation of a pastor is required. Award must be used to finance participation in a social justice activity either locally or abroad. Priority will be given to CWL members or relatives of CWL members. This is a yearly award that may be given to the same candidate repeatedly over the course of 10 years, or distributed among several applicants. Academic standing and background will be a consideration but not the determining factor.

Children's Aid Foundation Scholarship

Scholarships range from \$2,500 to \$5,000 and are awarded each year. Applications are open to students demonstrating both financial need and the potential to succeed in their program of study. The student must be a current (permanent) Crown Ward, or have been a Crown (permanent) Ward for at least one year after turning 13 years old.

Don McIntosh Memorial Fund Award

(2 x \$250)

This award will be given to a person with a physical disability who has demonstrated significant achievement in a particular field or activity or who is showing the potential in working on personal and community-oriented goals. Applications are invited from or on behalf

of persons with a physical disability. Each application should include basic demographic information and a resume outlining the applicant's work and achievements.

DynaIndustrial Scholarship

\$1,000 bursary to a qualifying First Nation/Metis student enrolled in the University of Regina, UR Accelerated Program. The intent of this bursary is to support and encourage an individual who has ambition, determination and a vision for their career. DynaIndustrial's hope is that this bursary will provide someone an opportunity to do something that they may not have had the chance to do otherwise.

This bursary will be presented to a self-declared First Nation/Metis student enrolled in the University of Regina UR Accelerated Program. The chosen recipient will display perseverance and diligence as a student. The student must be caring, generous, responsible, and involved in their community.

Ed Bitz Scholarship (2 x \$1000)

Softball Canada is currently accepting nominations for the Ed Bitz Scholarship, awarded to two registered Softball Canada umpires who are following their studies in a post-secondary educational institution.

AWARD PAUSED FOR NOW: End Distracted Driving Scholarship (\$1000)

Students who have not more than 20/70 vision after corrections, and who are continuing either their vocational or academic education are eligible for a [F.J.L. Woodcock/Sir Arthur Pearson Association of War Blinded Scholarship](#). Students should have a high degree of motivation, a reasonable level of achievement, and find the scholarship of assistance.

For the Love of Curling (10 x \$2500) & Fran Todd All Heart Scholarship (10 x \$2500)

Through the *For the Love of Curling* scholarship program, the curling community across Canada plays an active role in supporting the next generation of passionate, talented, and caring curlers. This annual scholarship program is available to student curling athletes who have been accepted into a post secondary education program.

The Fran Todd All Heart Scholarship is intended for young Canadian curling student-athletes who embody the values of curling, place the highest priorities on giving back to the sport, recipients are passionate about sharing curling with their community, and maintain a good level of academic standing.

Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria Scholarships (Several @ \$1500)

The Knights of Columbus Supreme Council awards Fourth Degree Pro Deo and Pro Patria (Canada) Scholarships annually. The number of scholarships awarded is determined by the earnings of the scholarship trust.

An applicant must be:

- A Canadian student entering freshman year of an undergraduate program leading to a baccalaureate degree at a college or university in Canada.
- A member in good standing in a Canadian council of the Knights of Columbus, or the son or daughter of such a member or deceased member. (Not limited to Fourth Degree members.)

Each scholarship of \$1,500 is awarded on the basis of academic excellence and is renewable each year of study, pending satisfactory academic performance, to a total of four years.

Fuelling Athlete and Coaching Excellence (FACE™)

This program provides funding to amateur athletes hoping to one day represent Canada at the Olympic and Paralympic games. Athletes and coaches can use the funding for: training, equipment, or for traveling to competitions. To date, the [FACE program](#) has helped over 2,400 Canadian athletes and their coaches by providing more than \$13.5 million dollars in direct financial support.

Gerry McCudden Memorial Scholarship Award (\$2000)

This scholarship is open to RCSD Grade 12s who have an average of 80% or higher in their Grade 12 year. Leadership potential and/or participation in leadership roles in school or community is necessary. See Student Services for the Personal Essay prompt (500 word essay required). Students must be accepted into a post-secondary institution for the fall.

Get Girls Golfing Scholarship (\$1500)

This scholarship is granted annually to one female high school senior that plays golf competitively in high school and intends to play golf as a freshman at a 2 or 4 year college. The scholarship will be awarded based on a combination of golf accomplishments, personal achievement, and overall need.

Girl Guides of Canada (\$1000-\$2000)

The National Scholarship Program is one of the ways that [Girl Guides of Canada-Guides du Canada \(GGC\)](#) recognizes girls and adult Members who embody the Mission and Values of the organization. This program supports “registered Members” who continue in Guiding, while they pursue their education / training at a recognized post-secondary institution. More than 25 awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$2,000. The number of scholarships awarded varies from year to year.

Girls Impact the World Scholarship Awards (\$2500- \$5000)

The ConnectHER Film Festival is an international youth competition that welcomes short films about issues that impact women and girls. Before making a film for submission, please read all of the following entry requirements:

- A) Films must focus on one of our topic areas. Categories include global girls' education, women and work, ending violence against women, women refugees, women's global health issues, women and the environment, women, and girls in tech, and redefining beauty.
- B) We accept every type of filmmaking form and style; whether animation or live-action, documentary or narrative.
- C) Filmmakers must be 13 to 25 years old at the submission date. That means that scripts, storyboards, directing, cinematography, editing, etc., must be done by people who meet this age requirement. Actors can be any age.
- D) Films must be original works that have not yet been screened at other major film festivals.
- E) Films must have been completed after January 1.
- F) Films must be 3 to 6 minutes long.
- G) Film file formats accepted are .mov and .mp4. HD resolution and optimized sound quality are highly preferred. Digital submission through Google Drive is preferred, but WeTransfer or Dropbox also works.
- H) All films must be subtitled in English.
- I) Films must be submitted by the deadline to qualify. No late submissions will be accepted.
- J) If your film contains any graphic content, include a warning near the beginning of the film. ConnectHER has full discretion about accepting films, particularly in instances where film submissions contain nudity, profanity, violence, or sexually explicit content.
- K) PowerPoints will not be accepted. Films must have some cinematic value.

Global Lift Equipment Scholarship (\$500)
