SCHOLARSHIP TERMS

Scholarship - A non-repayable sum of money awarded to a student to help finance further education. Most scholarships are based on merit in areas ranging from academic achievement to athletics. Usually, scholarships are not based on financial need.

Bursary - A non-repayable grant of money. Bursaries are awarded primarily based on financial need, but academic achievement is also considered. Usually, the applicant must provide detailed documentation describing their financial situation when applying for a bursary.

Entrance Award/Scholarship - A scholarship or award given to a student entering their first year at a post-secondary institution. Also referred to as an Admission Award.

Award - An award is given in recognition of outstanding achievement. Awards may be in the form of books, plaques, subscriptions or money. A monetary award is usually called a scholarship or bursary.

Grant – A non-repayable sum of money that may be awarded to a student based on their specific needs (e.g. Disability)

In-course Award/Continuing Scholarship - Awarded to students already enrolled in post-secondary studies, beyond the first year level. You will not be applying for these awards at this time.

How do I begin to get ready to apply for scholarships and bursaries?

Start by getting organized. Here is how...



1. Compile an activity-based resume.

Use only the last 4 years
Include all contacts
Organize activities into activity areas:

- Leadership
- Volunteer
- Community
- Employment
- Education/Courses
- Goals/Future Plans
- Accomplishments/Awards
- Extra-curricular clubs/sports



- 2. If a reference (referee) is required, contact the referee(s) at least two weeks prior to the first scholarship deadline
 - > Give them your resume
 - > Give them the scholarship criteria
 - > Ask them to save the letter



3. Begin the search


Parents and Grandparents: ask your employer, union, professional organization, service club, parish council, and community association

Students: ask your employer, search scholarship websites (including LeBoldus') and Google.

- Be prepared to write paragraphs, or essays.
- Be prepared to be interviewed or make a presentation.

Helpful notes and tips in getting started on your Scholarship search:

- As you begin identifying scholarships you wish to apply for, please consider creating a chart that can organize the title of the scholarship,
 the deadline, the required documents (i.e. essay, transcript, reference, etc.), the value this will help you to effectively track your progress in
 the application process (which can be daunting!) and ensure that you do not miss important details.
- Please note when applying for scholarships, that deadlines are non-negotiable.
- · If transcripts or references are required, be aware that it takes time for others to process your requests.
- Also be aware that if you must mail a document, it will likely take 2 or 3 days for your application to reach its destination.

Any scholarships requiring nomination of a student by an awards committee undergo the following process:

- All Grade 12 students are encouraged to review the Word document 'Scholarships to Browse' on the Student Services website and the Graduation Awards page that houses the school-based graduation awards.
- If students wish to be considered for any of the awards requiring school committee nomination, they must first confirm that they meet the criteria of such awards.
- They will then identify themselves to Student Services by the posted deadline. Application information is then reviewed with the student and a date is set for submitting necessary documents to an awards committee.
- 4. An awards committee convenes to review submissions and arrive at a consensus for LeBoldus' nominee.
- 5. Applicants are notified and thanked for their submissions, and the award winner is notified.
- 6. If additional materials are required to complete the application process, Student Services will work with the nominee to ensure that all necessary materials are ready for submission.

Scholarships are continuously added to this document - recently-added scholarships will be highlighted. The document contains a comprehensive collection of scholarships, but please view it as a starting point for your search. If a link within the document does not work, please do a Google search using the scholarship name.



Winter (January 10, 2026 - February 15, 2026)

Apprenticeship (September 15, 2025 - June 15, 2026)

How To Apply:

- 1. Sign in using your Saskatchewan Polytechnic student login and password, and complete the General Application. This information is used to **automatically match** you to many of our student award opportunities. If you have already completed your General Application in the current academic year, please confirm that all information entered is correct and up to date.
- 2. Any additional opportunities requiring further details will be identified as "Recommended Opportunities" and will require you to provide additional information.
- 3. Once you have completed your General Application and any Recommended Opportunities, you can click on "My Applications" to view all the opportunities you have applied for. You will receive an email stating that your application was accepted. If you do not see this email, please check your spam folder.
- 4. To make changes to your applications, you can update your General Application, or click on "Update" under the Recommended Opportunity. You can make changes until 11:59 p.m. of the deadline date.

Please note – You will be considered for all of the opportunities listed under "Current" on the "My Applications" tab, but you are not guaranteed to receive an award. If there are any opportunities that still require attention once the application cycle is closed, your application for that opportunity will not be considered.

Successful applicants will be notified by email within 4 weeks of the cycle's closing date.

USask Entrance Scholarships

The University of Saskatchewan (USask) recognizes 600 high-achieving entering students each year with USask Entrance Scholarships valued at **\$5,000**. Students entering direct-entry degree programs will be considered automatically for these awards—distributed between the Colleges of Agriculture and Bioresources, Arts and Science, Dentistry, Education, Engineering, Kinesiology and Edwards School of Business—based on admission average.

To be considered, submit the online application for admission, including the application fee, by **February 15**, and ensure your transcript and other admission documents have been submitted to the Admissions Office by March 1.

Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships

Best and Brightest Entrance Scholarships are USask's highest valued, renewable entrance scholarships and are awarded based on academics, leadership and contributions to school and community life.

Five of these awards, known as the Circle of Honour Awards, are designated for Indigenous students.

To be considered:

- Complete your application for admission by **Dec 1** and
- fill out and submit the online application for Best and Brightest Scholarships by December
 15 in PAWS
