# Graduation Requirements

#### THE CREDIT SYSTEM

High school students (Grades 10, 11, 12) operate on a credit system. For each class successfully completed, students earn one credit.

- ✓ Students require a minimum of <u>24</u> credits to graduate
- ✓ 14 classes (credits) are compulsory for the English program. Therefore, students have a minimum of 10 electives.
- ✓ 17 courses (credits) are compulsory for the French immersion program. Therefore, students have a minimum of 7 electives.
- French Immersion students must have a minimum of 12 credits in French Immersion classes/courses

#### Graduation Requirements (English Program)

24 credits including the following:

**ELA 10 AND ELA 20 AND ELA 30 Financial Literacy 10** Native Studies 10 OR History 10 Math 10 AND Math 20 Science 10 AND Science 20 Canadian Studies 30 Catholic Studies 10 AND 20 AND 30 Wellness 10 OR Phys Ed 20 OR Phys Ed 30

4 core credits

20 or 30-level

PLUS 10 more courses (electives)!

10 = Grade 10 level class

20 = Grade 11 level class

30 = Grade 12 level class

Five credits must be at the 30-level

At least 8 electives must be at the



# Graduation Requirements (French Immersion Program)

24 credits including the following:

ELA 10 <u>AND</u> ELA 20 <u>AND</u> ELA 30 Français10 <u>AND</u> 20 <u>AND</u> 30 Littératie financière 10 Histoire 10

Mathématiques 10 AND Mathématiques 20

Sciences 10 AND Science 20

Sciences sociales 30

Études catholiques 10 <u>AND</u> 20 <u>AND</u> 30

Mieux-être 10 OR Phys Ed 20 OR Phys Ed 30

10 = Grade 10 level class

20 = Grade 11 level class

30 = Grade 12 level class

Five credits must be at the 30-level

At least 5 electives must be at the 20 or 30-level

Students must achieve 12 French Immersion credits (required among them are Français 10, 20, 30)

PLUS 7 more courses (electives)!
