To meet the requirements for bilingual mention on the transcript of Secondary Level achievement, students are required to complete a minimum of twelve credits taken in French throughout grades 10, 11 and 12. The courses necessary for bilingual mention include three French Language Arts courses (Français immersion 10, 20, 30) as well as three English Language Arts courses (English Language Arts 10 A (or B), 20, 30 A (or B)). The other French credits can be obtained from courses in the remaining areas of study or electives that are taught in French. NOTE: High Schools may survey for the above mentioned electives. However, the High Schools may not necessarily be able to offer all electives if enrollment numbers are insufficient.

Other Information

Learning Resource Program

Parents often inquire about learning resource programs for students who require additional learning support at the high school level. Recent reports indicate that French **Immersion** classrooms are more inclusive to a broader spectrum of learners and parents are choosing to retain their children in FSL programs. Many learning resource students can and do achieve well in French Immersion with the collaboration of the learning resource teacher. classroom teacher and supportive families.

French learning resource program supports are available for all Regina Catholic French Immersion students at the high school level. Please contact the high school for additional information about the French Immersion High School Learning Resource Program.

HOW PROFICIENT WILL MY CHILD BE?

Learners in French immersion programs generally attain a level of proficiency that exceeds that of a core program, thanks to the time and intensity involved. Recent testing in some Canadian school boards has shown that French immersion students in Grade 12 generally succeed at a B2 level on the international DELF assessment, which means they can interact effectively with native French speakers as well as understand and produce complex oral and written texts.³ The intensive exposure to the target language allows students to quickly reach the level of proficiency required to learn their subjects in the new language. High school French immersion graduates should be able to work in or pursue post-secondary studies in French.



WILL IMMERSION GRADUATES HAVE TROUBLE IN UNIVERSITY OR COLLEGE BECAUSE THEY DIDN'T TAKE HIGH SCHOOL SUBJECTS IN ENGLISH?

A survey of Canadian university students¹⁰ found that the majority of French immersion graduates surveyed reported no difficulty in adjusting to university courses offered in English. In fact, French immersion graduates have more options than other students because in Canada they may choose to take some or all post-secondary courses in their second language. The majority of survey respondents reported no difficulty in making the transition from high school to university courses in French.

Senate Page Program Pages are full-time students who work part-time at the Parliament in Ottawa while completing their studies. They are regionally selected students who attend post- secondary institutions within the National Capital Region. RCSD French Immersion Bursary

Regina Catholic Schools offers a bursary program for any RCSD graduates that enter into the Baccalauréat en éducation program. This bursary is available for all four years of post-secondary education. This program is a return service; bursary during years one and two will be \$1,000.00 per year and for years three and four the bursary will increase to \$1,500.00 per year. In turn, this will require a two-year service commitment to the RCSD upon successful completion of the education degree.
